The National Network to Eliminate Disparities in Behavioral Health (the NNED), supported by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), invites you to participate in its second annual training opportunity, NNEDLearn 2012. Based on input from the NNED, **SIX** training tracks will be offered to build skills in evidence-supported and culturally appropriate clinical, consumer, and organizational practices. With your support, the NNED has continued to thrive as a federal-community partnership geared to addressing mental health and substance abuse issues for those serving diverse ethnic and racial communities.

The SIX Training Tracks offered through NNEDLearn 2012

- Committing to Authentic Peer Support Services in Your Organization
- Culturally Adapted Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Latinos/Hispanics
- Empowering Our Spirits Tribal Suicide Prevention Program: The Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)
- Motivational Interviewing
- Strengthening Families Program (SFP 10-14)
- The Four Cs of Collaboration: Change, Culture, Conflict, and Communication

Plus, a Plenary Session on Trauma and a Trauma-Informed Organizational Approach. CEUs Available.

SAMHSA's Commitment:

Recognizing challenging fiscal times, yet the need for continued capacity building and practitioner development in our communities, **SAMHSA will cover the costs of training, travel and lodging** for NNEDLearn 2012 participants.

Agency Commitment:

Our experience shows that the commitment from organizational leadership maximizes the benefits to participants, the agency, and to SAMHSA. We also recognize that training more than one person from an agency supports the uptake of a program or practice. SAMHSA is requesting that agencies apply for teams of 2-5 participants and verify support from agency leadership or supervisors to commit to the full NNEDLearn 2012 training model.

NNEDLearn 2012 Training Model

Realizing that it takes more than a 2-day training to implement new practices or programs, SAMHSA is requesting that NNED Partner Organizations and their leadership commit to active participation in the NNEDLearn 2012 Model which includes: pre-work; a 2 ½ day on-site training; and participation in a post-training 6-month follow up as a “virtual” community of practice.

- *Pre-work* prepares the NNED Partner for the on-site training and involves participation in a webinar (1 ½ hours) and completion of readiness assignments prior to the on-site training.
- The *on-site training* will occur on March 13-15 in Albuquerque, New Mexico and involves 15.5 hours of direct training and an opportunity to share community best practices with other participants.
- *Post-training work* will occur over the course of six months. Each training track becomes a “community of practice” that provides ongoing coaching and follow-up to support the uptake of the practice or program. This is done through regular webinars, teleconferences and online discussion forums with the trainers.

Added Attraction: Showcase Your Agency Innovations

We learned from NNED Learn 2011 that participants wanted to know more about each other’s organizations. This year, participants will have the opportunity to be part of the launch of the [NNED “Innovations Collaboratory”](#) an online exchange of innovative community practices.

Application Review Process:

- Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis until 20 slots are filled for each track. Availability of training is dependent on getting a minimum number of registered participants.
- Once accepted, participants will be sent confirmation of the accepted training track, supporting material, and a travel form.
- Participants will need to complete an online travel form by February 10.
